**International Master Study Programme
Global Change Management (M.Sc.)**

Students with (at least) a Bachelor's degree can apply at Eberswalde University for Sustainable Development, Germany, to be one of the 25 participants admitted for the two-year study programme Global Change Management (M.Sc.). Classes start on the last week of September.

The mission of Global Change Management is to educate young professionals who are able to cope with challenges of natural resource management under global change in an adaptive, proactive and precautionary manner. This will be achieved by developing goal-oriented and science-informed solutions that are ultimately directed towards sustainability. Essentially, students systemically analyse global change in its causes and effects as well as socioeconomic and political framework conditions. The emphasis is on both, mitigation of and adaptation to the current global change impacts on ecosystems and societies. A diverse, practical and up-to-date study programme is implemented through close cooperation with renowned institutions of related research and practical background. These partner institutions are among others the Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ), Germanwatch, Munich RE Foundation, the Naturschutzbund Deutschland (NABU) and the Potsdam Institute for Climate Impact Research (PIK). They share their expertise by offering own teaching modules integrated into the study programme.



In addition to classes by lecturers and invited experts, the course also focuses on participation and discussion. Study language is English. The study programme includes a project based research semester (in Germany or abroad) and visits to partner organisations. Although the university provides some financial support, students have to pay for the travel and accommodation costs themselves.

The university does not charge tuition fees, but charges a small semester fee of approx. 350,- euros per semester, which includes the student ticket for all public transport in Brandenburg and Berlin as well as the use of all student facilities (especially the meal in the student canteen, among other offers). The monthly financial requirement is about 600,- Euro for accommodation in a student (or private) dormitory and meals.

The study programme, which is offered annually, can only be started in autumn. For international applicants, the application period is between 01 and 30 April (via UNI-ASSIST / www.uni-assist.de). **WCU and RSC students should pre-register internally by 1 March at the latest by sending an email to the coordinator Christoph Nowicki (christoph.nowicki@hnee.de).**

For this interesting, relevant and challenging programme, highly motivated applicants with a disposition to self-study and group assignments are most welcome. As especially the first two semesters are quite time demanding, we strongly recommend that students do not work at the same time during the lecture period (semester breaks are better suited for this purpose).
